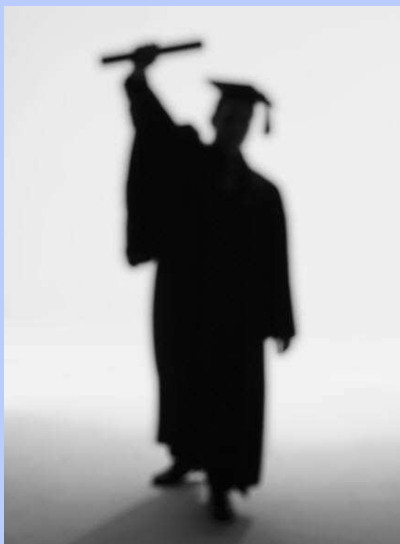


Education Reduces Crime
